Uttar Pradesh — General Knowledge

Uttar Pradesh, meaning “Northern Province,” is a major state in northern India and the country’s most populous. With a population exceeding 241 million, it is also the most populous sub-national unit in the world, accounting for about 16.5 percent of India’s population and roughly 3 percent of the global population. By area, it is India’s fourth-largest state, covering 243,286 square kilometres.

The state shares borders with Rajasthan to the west; Haryana, Himachal Pradesh, and the National Capital Territory of Delhi to the northwest; Uttarakhand and Nepal to the north; Bihar to the east; and Madhya Pradesh, Chhattisgarh, and Jharkhand to the south. Lucknow is the capital and largest city, while Prayagraj serves as the judicial capital. Administratively, Uttar Pradesh is divided into 18 divisions and 75 districts.

Formed on 24 January 1950 after India became a republic, Uttar Pradesh succeeded the United Provinces, which themselves evolved from the British-era North-Western Provinces and the Oudh Province. In 2000, its north-western Himalayan region was separated to create the state of Uttaranchal, now known as Uttarakhand.

Uttar Pradesh has a bicameral legislature consisting of a Legislative Assembly and a Legislative Council. It plays a decisive role in national politics, electing 80 members to the Lok Sabha and 31 to the Rajya Sabha. The Allahabad High Court, located at Prayagraj, is among the oldest high courts in India.

Geographically, much of the state lies in the fertile Indo-Gangetic Plain, making agriculture a central activity. The Ganges and Yamuna rivers, along with tributaries such as the Gomti and Sarayu, shape the state’s landscape and economy. The rivers Ganges and Yamuna meet at the Triveni Sangam in Prayagraj, one of Hinduism’s most sacred pilgrimage sites. Forests cover about six percent of the state’s area, primarily in the northern Terai region.

Historically, the region has been a cradle of Indian civilization and power. It formed the heartland of several major dynasties and empires, including the Maurya, Gupta, Vardhana, Delhi Sultanate, and Mughal empires. During the colonial era, it contained influential princely states and played a pivotal role in the Indian freedom struggle, notably during the uprising of 1857.

Culturally, Uttar Pradesh encompasses diverse regions such as Braj and Rohilkhand in the west, Awadh and Bundelkhand in the centre, and Purvanchal in the east. Hindi is the official and most widely spoken language, with Urdu recognised as an additional official language. The state holds exceptional religious significance. It is home to some of Hinduism’s holiest cities—Varanasi, Mathura, Ayodhya, and Prayagraj. Buddhism is closely associated with the region, as Gautama Buddha delivered his first sermon at Sarnath near Varanasi. Sites linked to Jainism are also present, and since medieval times the state has been an important centre of Islamic culture, learning, and architecture.

Economically, Uttar Pradesh has transitioned from an agriculture-dominated economy—long known for sugar production—to one led largely by the services sector, including tourism, real estate, finance, and hospitality. It now has one of the largest state economies in India, ranking third in overall output.
